Funding will be a hurdle to this project, so a Capital Campaign is likely on the horizon.
- 2) Welcome a Lay Ministry Resident who will serve the parish for 1 year. After earning her M.Div in May, she will join us in June, doing much of what a Curate would do. She will help the parish in various capacities while she discerns how God would have her serve His Church in the future. Our current plan is to hire an ordained Curate in June 2026.

My biggest plea to the parish in 2025 is simply to engage. Come to worship every week, and bring a friend. Read your Bible regularly. Serve God's church and His people with intention. Live from His joy and follow His lead courageously and faithfully. If we all do these things, Church of Our Saviour will be such a beacon of Christian vitality that there will be no limit to how He blesses us, and blesses our community through us!







• We were \$42,500 or 5.3% worse than budget in pledged giving.

• Total revenues were \$19,000 or 1.5% better than budget. The primary reason is unpledged giving, which was almost \$43,000 or 40% better than budget.

• Total Expenses were better than the budget by \$20,500 or 1.6%. The primary reason for this favorable variance is due to budgeting for an Associate Rector in July. The favorable impact compared to budget was \$48,500.

• Operations expense was \$2,500 or 1% better than budget. Operations/Property and Maintenance expense as a percentage of total cost increased from 16% in 2023 to 22% in 2024. This is primarily due to our new Sanctuary roof.

• We donated \$25,000 to the Church Foundation compared to \$20,000 in 2023. Our goal is to donate all annual Trust proceeds to the Foundation. This will take many years as the Trust income in 2024 was approximately \$130,000 – approximately 10% of total income.

• We received a \$125,000 gift from an Estate during the year. Almost \$100,000 remains in our coffers. The rest of the funds - \$25,000 – were used to finally obtain a true and accurate survey of our property and to pay for our conceptual planning project for our administrative offices and Great Hall.

• We did not give pay raises to staff and clergy this year. We did pay performance bonuses in recognition of a great year and their individual contributions. The bonuses averaged 5% of salaries and including payroll taxes, were approximately \$30,000.

• Our cash liquidity position remains strong, and we are right at our stated goal of 3 months of cash reserves, net of restricted and designated funds. This is a very conservative cash management policy.
